

Ruth Harker

Ruth has been a Non-Executive Director of Birmingham Children's Trust since 2017, where she joined the newly established 'shadow board' to set up an independent trust. Ruth is extremely proud of the progress they made which saw them being removed from Special Measures, and the progress which this crucial service continues to make. Ruth has got to know Birmingham well, having taught there for 40 years, including 20 years as a Headteacher / Executive Headteacher in the Northfield area. Ruth moved to Northfield from Holte School in Lozells to become Deputy Headteacher at Shenley Court School. Seven years later she crossed the A38 to become Headteacher of Bournville School and Sixth Form Centre. It was then an underperforming school, but sustained improvements led to it becoming a Leading Edge, High Performing School and one of the first Business Enterprise Colleges nationally. In 2005 when Shenley Academy's predecessor school was placed in Special Measures, Ruth was seconded by the Local Authority to lead improvements, taking it out of Special Measure to Outstanding in four terms. Ruth subsequently led both schools before she took the opportunity to become Principal Designate for the new Shenley

Academy. Ruth's first task was to work with architects to plan the new building, then with staff and students to set up the new school. It became one of Birmingham's first academies, innovative and highly effective, building strong links with the community, other schools and a wide range of sports, business and arts organisations, reflected in the Artsmark Gold Award. Ruth remained there as Principal until her retirement in 2016. Ruth was a member of the Governing Body of the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital Birmingham for seven years during the period which saw the planning and inception of its superb new building.

Caroline retired in August 2018 after working in Education for 36 Years. She trained as a teacher for the Deaf and taught deaf children in various schools in the North of England for 18 years. The second half of her career was within Special Schools in Birmingham as a teacher, deputy, and finally Head of School. She was also instrumental in establishing a Post 19 College for young people with Profound and Multiple Learning difficulties.

Having worked within Birmingham, and more specifically in the Northfield area, Caroline is well aware of the challenges faced by some of the young people in the city.

Caroline has been a Trustee at the Edge for several years, part of the Full Governing Board and also the Finance Committee.
