Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you are all well as we approach the end of the second half term. I am writing with details of the recreational visits taking place next week as part of our second "Cultural Capital Week" of the academic year.

Every student is expected to be in school, on time, every day. Our final week at school will include academic and recreational activities both as a part of our curriculum offer and also as a reward for the good work completed throughout this term.

Monday 13th December 2021: Year 10 Trip. Tenpin bowling at Star City, including lunch, followed by 18 holes of crazy golf at Adventure Island Mini Golf. Students will need to arrive in school by 9.15am and will return to school for 3.15pm for end of day departure.

Tuesday 14th December 2021: Year 11A Trip. Tenpin bowling at Star City, including lunch, followed by 18 holes of crazy golf at Adventure Island Mini Golf. Students will need to arrive in school by 9.15am and will return to school for 3.15pm for end of day departure.

Tuesday 14th December 2021: Year 8 Trip. Ice Skating at Centenary Square, Birmingham, followed by a ride on the Big Wheel and lunch. Students will need to arrive in school by 9.15am and will return to school for 3.15pm for end of day departure.

Wednesday 15th December 2021: Year 11B Trip. Tenpin bowling at Star City, including lunch, followed by 18 holes of crazy golf at Adventure Island Mini Golf. Students will need to arrive in school by 9.15am and will return to school for 3.15pm for end of day departure.

Thursday 16th December: Year 9 Trip. Ice Skating at Centenary Square, Birmingham, followed by a ride on the Big Wheel and lunch in Birmingham City Centre. Students will need to **arrive in school no later than 9.00am** so they can leave immediately. Ice skating is at 10.00am and the big wheel is at 11.00am. Students will be returned to school by 12.15pm for an early departure and start to their Christmas holidays.

In line with our "Safe, Ready, Respectful" ethos, the cost all of these activities will be fully met by The Edge Academy, including hiring of equipment for all practical activities. Lunches and general refreshments will also be provided as normal. Students may bring a small amount of additional spending money with them to external venues if they wish to at their own risk.

Students will need warm clothing if they are attending the ice skating sessions. I suggest a spare pair of socks and gloves are worn; sensible clothing and footwear is needed for all other practical activities.
