The practical Food Preparation and Nutrition examination, and investigation, is worth 50% of the final GCSE grade. Therefore, we are working with small groups of students throughout the week - commencing Monday 13th February - to ensure they can achieve their highest possible practical GCSE grade.

Students have already planned their three-course meal and will be supported by their classroom teacher in creating it. All students will be given an individual date to come into school where they will be working from 9.30am until 1.30pm in creating their dishes. These need to be of the highest quality and students need to show the following skills, knowledge and understanding:



- Planning of the three dishes
- Preparation
- Cooking
- Presentation of food
- Application of nutrition

Once students have completed their dish, they may need to evaluate what they have cooked, the techniques they have used and how they have presented their meal.

Students will be told in the next week which session they must attend.

In response to student voice and in recognition of the intense workload for students in the coming fortnight, school will finish at 12pm for Year 11 students only on Friday 3rd February so that students can revise from home rather than attending afternoon enrichment sessions.
